A Workshop at the F.D. Alpaiwalla Museum, Mumbai

The Legacy of Parsi Women in India: Workshop

This Workshop will discuss some of the key areas in which women participated in the development of Indian society and culture during the 19th and early 20th centuries and the impact this had on modern professional, domestic and devotional life. It will consider how the role of women grew in a society that was in transition. How did women become the agents for change during this period? What persuaded some Parsi women to lead the way out of the more repressive aspects of two prevailing systems: colonial rule and Parsi patriarchy?

Speakers from across India with a few from the UK, USA, and Hong Kong, will address the different areas in which Parsi women gained agency and prominence in the fields of law, education, medicine, literature, politics, theatre, media, and in domestic and devotional life.

F.D. Alpaiwalla Museum

The F.D. Alpaiwalla Museum, administered by the Bombay Parsi Panchayat (BPP) - the apex administrative body of the Parsi community in India - will host the Workshop at its premises in the Memorial Building, Kharaghat Colony, Malabar Hill, Mumbai.

The museum was restored, upgraded and reopened on 27 March 2025 with a generous grant from the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. It is the only archaeological and ethnographic museum in the world dedicated to the Zoroastrian community. Its collection includes a firman issued by the Mughal Emperor Jahangir, coins, excavations from a dakhma in Iran dating from the 17th century, Chinese porcelain and a substantial library. Items, such as the inner sanctum of a fire temple commissioned for the Everlasting Flame exhibition at the Brunei Gallery, SOAS in 2013, and in the National Museum in Delhi in 2016, have also been donated to the Museum.

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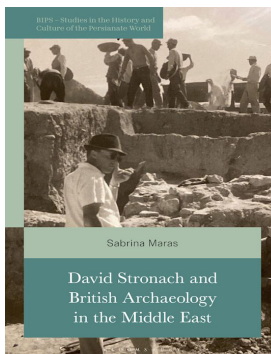
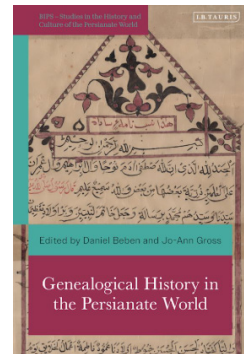
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BIPS Publications
